What is CEN/ISSS?



"The mission of CEN/ISSS is to provide market players with a comprehensive and integrated range of standardization-oriented services and products, in order to contribute to the success of the Information Society in Europe"

- Formed in mid-1997, we act as a focal point for ICT issues within CEN
- Through open standards Workshops, as well as some traditional Technical Committees, we provide consensus documents
- Also open Focus Groups investigative reports







Why do standards and research need better synergies?



- Standardisation is carried out for several reasons.
 - Establishment of compatibility and interoperability (critical!)
 - Improved market for standard products
 - Removal of trade barriers
 - Safety & health of citizens
- But an effective interface with standardisation can be beneficial to research projects as well
 - Increase quality of products and create competitive advantages for consortium partners
 - Test products according to internationally agreed principles
 - Higher international recognition, greater visibility & exploitation potential of projects' results
 - Use external expertise, saving project resources
 - Avoid going through a maze of standards bodies finding the proper one with the right procedures supporting the project








Background and objectives behind the COPRAS project



- Interfacing with standardisation is required for research projects under Framework Programmes
- Standardisation activities are many times already underway with respect to many aspects in IST
- Structuring cooperation will reduce overlap and save resources on the side of research projects
- Cooperation at an early stage will make research results available earlier to industry & society









COPRAS – an new interface platform



- Stimulate interaction & exchange between FP6 projects in calls 1, 2 & 3 and standardisation groups
- Act as a facilitating platform for projects wishing to upgrade their deliverables through standardisation
- Prepare generic information on RTD/standards interfacing guiding those proposing or evaluating future projects
- Start: 1st February 2004
- End: 31st January 2007

COPRAS was initiated by the 3 **European Standards Organisations** together with W3C and The Open Group, but backed by the ICTSB








The ICTSB aims to coordinate ICT standardisation in Europe



- Analyse standards requirements from any competent source
- Based on concrete market needs
- Translate these requirements into coherent, approved programmes and allocate projects
- Processes in the ICTSB:



COPRAS will streamline the interface between standardisation & research...



- Survey projects for standards related output
- Analyse feedback & select projects to define Standardisation Action Plans with
- Install mechanisms & tools for cooperation between research and standardisation, also across different areas
- Arrange input from research projects into standardisation processes and promote new work items resulting from research project's output
- Ensure relevant input from standards bodies to research projects








...and structure cooperation & exchange with selected projects



- Tailored Standardisation Action Plans will be prepared with each of the selected projects
- Mutual information exchange will be facilitated



The Standardisation Plans will be defined early in the process



- Inviting contributions from selected projects
- Facilitating introduction research projects' output in relevant standardisation groups
- Preparing target dates & milestones for deliverable standards, to enable the coherent execution of the Action Plans
- Initiating or promoting new standardisation items
- Covering the 'time gap' between availability of projects' results and standardisation







Results will be available halfway throughout COPRAS' lifetime



- Target response from questionnaire: 50%
 - Call 1 now up to 70 per cent!
- Standardisation Action Plans: 8%
 - Responses under analysis
- First results of the project expected Q2 & Q3 2005
 - Kick off Standardisation Action Plans for Call 1
 - Interim documentation
 - Interim evaluation







COPRAS will pay specific attention to promoting the project & its results



- Web-site (www.copras.org)
- Information Package
- Promoting the project at seminars & conferences (eg IST 2004)
- Organising liaison between standardisation community, research community and COPRAS
- Producing brochures documenting cases & interim results & throughout the project
- Preparing & maintaining generic material on standardisation to support consecutive IST calls
- Organising Open Meeting at the end of the project







A variety of stakeholders will benefit from the project and its results



Research and standardization aspects of the eEurope activity will be linked with further IST deployment

Standards will be available to the industry and the general public at an earlier time

COPRAS

Research projects, that have a cost-effective way of setting up an interface with the standards world

Standards bodies can reduce overlap and better organise flow of relevant material









CEN/ISSS ran a pilot under FP5 dealing with eCommerce projects



C-ECOM

- Examined 220 projects that seemed to be developing standardized concepts or required advice on standards issues
- Short-listed some 50 and contacted them
- Defined 20 item "work programme" including advice to research consortia, and proposals to standardization









Several projects found dealing with eBusiness in the construction sector



- Discussions with eConstruct, ICCI and ROADCON Cluster: common issues for consensus on use of XML for "business messages"
- Result: CEN/ISSS Workshop launched, to reach open consensus on 'CEN Workshop Agreements', now approved:
 - European eConstruction Framework
 - European eConstruction Architecture
 - European eConstruction Meta Schema
 - European eConstruction OntologyFramework
 - European eConstruction Software implementation toolset
