Cascading **S**tyle **S**heets

- CSS1: authors can expect full support on browsers.
- CSS2: growing support for new selectors and positioning media-specific style sheets, downloadable fonts, etc.
- CSS3: work has started...

- Modularisation
(mobile devices, voice browsing, desktop PCs)
- More support for non-western scripts
(right-to-left, vertical, etc.)

- Stylable using CSS



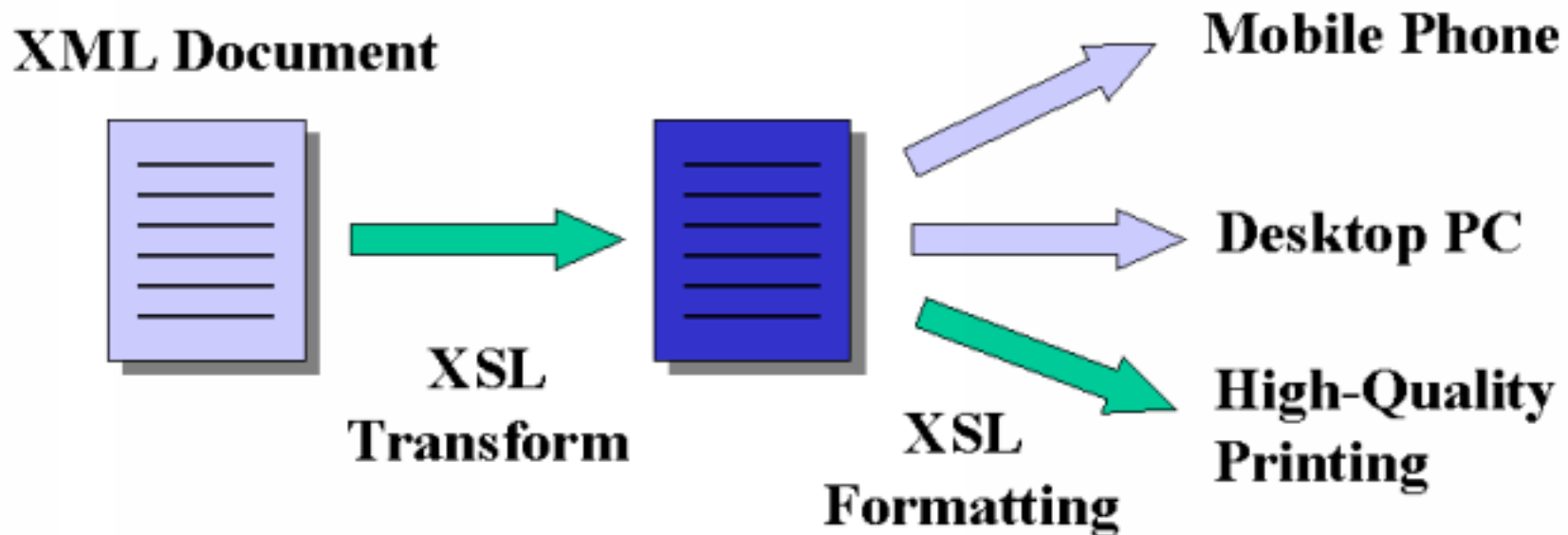
