- Consortium
 - 350 members

- Standards: XML, HTML, Semantic Web, VoiceXML, Web Services ...
- Mobile Web Initiative since 2004

- Applications
 - Facebook
 - User-generated content
 - Mail, ...
- Technology: AJAX
 - HTML, CSS, Javascript for applications
 - Crossing OS and browser boundaries



Mobile Applications



- Web 2.0 applications popular
 - Social networking dominates mobile Web use
- But: Applications using native code
 - iPhone: Objective C
 - Symbian: C++
 - Android: Java
 - ...

Mobile Web Apps



- Can overcome mobile OS fragmentation and App store fragmentation
- More developers available
- Need to extend Web platform
 - Device Access and Policy
 - Geolocation
 - HTML5
 - W3C Widgets

Geolocation



- Browser access to latitude, longitude, ...
- Deployment: Chrome, Firefox, Opera, Safari, ...
- Started only in Q4 08
- Standard expected Q1 2010

HTML5



- HTML as application platform
 - Offline storage, operation
 - Video, Canvas
 - ...
- Deployment: Chrome, Firefox, Opera, Safari, ...

W3C Widgets



- Downloadable Web App
 - Packaging HTML, Javascript, CSS
 - Signing
- Deployment: Access, BONDI, Microsoft, Opera, Vodafone, ...
- Standard progressing well



Conclusion



- Web is quickly becoming fully functional mobile app platform
- Support by many major players
- Removes current platform fragmentation issues
- Learn from the desktop!
- Next Frontier(?): Voice Interaction
