Workshop Topics

- How different organisations, public and private, have identified and prioritised their data sets;
- Examples where datasets have been crowd-sourced to circumvent reluctance to publish the official version and the impact this is having;
- How PSI providers have collected and responded to demand for specific datasets;
- How users of data have communicated with providers and whether the providers feel that their efforts are worthwhile.

In short, this workshop is about the relationship between data owners and data re-users, whether those re-users are from other parts of the same organisation or external to it. The focus is on the public sector but, as ever, there are many lessons that can be learned from the private, research and cultural heritage sectors which are equally welcome.







Workshop Aims

To help define Best Practice and available methods for:

- assessing the priority order for releasing datasets;
- making high quality reference datasets available;
- making available data that may be incomplete or imperfect in such a way that it is valuable to re-users but that does not put a heavy burden of liability on providers;
- receiving and acting on feedback from the user community.










Timișoara









- 3rd most populous city in RO (+300,000 inhabitants)
- + 50,000 students
- 2nd biggest airport in the country
- ~10,000 employed in IT
- Started the 1989 revolution against the Communist regime
