Without 'break-after: avoid'

Typographers try to avoid that a heading gets separated from the paragraph that follows it. If the heading is at the bottom of a page or a column and the next paragraph is on the next page or in the next column, the heading is more difficult to recognize and the paragraph is also not immediately seen as the first one of a separate section. It is better in such a case to leave the bottom of the page or the column empty and put the heading on the next page or in the next column, so that the paragraph is visually right below it.

In CSS, the properties that control page and column breaks are 'break-before', 'break-after' and 'break-inside'. In this case, we need 'breakafter', and we set it on the heading with a value of 'avoid'. That tells the formatter to do its best to avoid a page break after the heading: H2 { break-after: avoid }
